Goal #1 Goal

Improve proficiency rates by 3% in each of the core subject areas of English, Math, and Science.

Academic Areas

- Reading
- Mathematics
- Writing
- Science

Measurements

We will improve current proficiency rates by 3%. Current Proficiency rates are:

Science 28%

Language Arts 29%

Math 24%

The SAGE test will be used to measure the improvements.

Action Plan Steps

2 teacher buyouts in Science and Math at approximately \$9,000 each to reduce class sizes which will increase student learning and proficiency = \$18,000.

Academic Advocate to work with struggling students in Math, Science and English to attain proficiency = \$18,000.

Tutoring before and after school in the subject areas of Math, Science and English to help reteach key concepts and provide support where needed to increase proficiency = \$5000.

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Solution Tree PLC/RTI conference for 10 staff members to increase efficiency of PLC and develop additional interventions in all subject areas \$689 x 10 = \$6890.

Travel to conferences (in SLC) in form of parking and additional costs = \$500.

Multiple Mini Grants for Teachers to provide additional learning activities and student engagement directed related to subject matter for proficiency. Each grant not to exceed \$500 and up to \$5000 total.

Computer Software to support students and teachers in different subject areas (ex. ALEKS, Mobi Max, Kuta etc.) that will increase learning and proficiency = \$5000.

Conferences and Substitute Teachers for Educational Leave for additional training for teachers of all subject areas to be trained on new learning strategies and ideas = \$5000.

Additional Library books and upgrade existing inventory to stay current. Will allow students to increase literacy and proficiency in reading = \$2000.
